Where does the purr come from? Purring originates in the vocal chords. The sound is produced as the chords vibrate, as they are rapidly pulled to and fro by the muscles in the walls of the larynx (or voice box). These muscles are, in turn, controlled by nerves that set the rhythm of the purr. We associate purring with pleasure, but cats may also purr after being involved in traffic accidents or when frightened, such as when they are at the veterinary surgery.
