The Dangers of Chicken Jerky Treats

Reports from Canada and USA are seeing an increase in the number of dog illness complaints related to the consumption of Chinese made chicken jerky pet treats during the past year and are recommending avoiding any pet food products that are produced in China. Illnesses associated with the consumption of the products include Kidney Failure and Fanconi Syndrome. Symptoms can occur within hours or days of consumption and can include: decreased appetite; decreased activity; vomiting; diarrhea, sometimes with blood; increased water consumption and/or increased urination. If you are buying pet food treats for your pets, check the label carefully of where it's produced and what it contains. Any concerns, discuss with your local vets.
